

MORGAN HILL, Calif., June 11, 2020—Outride and BikeNWA are partnering to bring Riding for Focus to middle school students in six Northwest Arkansas schools. The program, supported by a Walton Family Foundation grant at the recommendation of Steuart Walton and Tom Walton, will enable approximately 2,400 students over the next five years learn bicycle skills, safety, and knowledge to become lifelong riders.

The Riding for Focus program will include a fleet of up to 34 Specialized bikes for each school. The bikes are easy to build and maintain due to their customized and durable design. Additionally, teacher training and cycling curriculum will be provided to the schools for implementation.

Outride is committed to improving the lives of youth through cycling. Through their Primary Research, Riding for Focus cycling program, and Outride Fund grant-giving activities, they provide evidence-based cycling interventions to improve social, emotional, and cognitive health.

"Partnerships with community organizations such as BikeNWA are an exciting and important step towards reaching an even larger and more diverse student population. Historically, Arkansas has been referred to as both the "The Land of Opportunity" and the "Natural State," and we are excited that this collaboration will provide a new opportunity for so many kids to get outside and into nature to improve their life-long health and well-being. **Background:** In the Fall of 2019, BikeNWA, in partnership with Outride and private funders, helped to bring Riding for Focus to Huntsville Middle School. Utilizing a fleet of bikes engineered for optimized, reliable use and an easy-to-follow curriculum, middle school students learn riding etiquette, fitness and training concepts, decision making, and bike handling skills. The program became an instant favorite among students and staff for its positive impact on the students' mental and physical well-being.
